
AQUACULTURE

Main Cultured Species: Cat Fish, Red Tilapia White Shrimp, Seaweed

- Decrease in coastal landings due to lack of effort.
- Increasing of price

Pelagic Fish (39%) & Demersal Fish (26%)

Employment Act 1955.

- 18 years old for minimum age limit.

Fishing Vessel License Policy:

- 18 years old for minimum age limit.
- No maximum age limit.

No condition of gender.

Establish of community Based Management involving women and youth.

- Empower women's economy through community.
- Grant for youth participation.

CURRENT STATUS

Small Scale Capture Fisheries:

- 85,927 person
- 2% are women

Small Scale Aquaculture


- 20,963 person
- 6% are women

Post harvest

- 214 person
- 47% are women

Resources:


- Trainers/ Expertise

- Automation and Mechanization
- Modern equipment

Raw Material:

- Availability
- price



Level of compliance by local exporter to fulfill requirement by importing country (small scale, costly)

Stringent requirement set by importing country

Certification on certain product that can be difficult and costly to obtain.

Market preferences : Importing countries may have varying preferences for types of fish, processing methods, and packaging, requiring exporters to adapt before exporting their product
