GLOBAL SLOWER GROWTH AMID TARIFFS AND UNCERTAINTY

Growth in the major advanced economies in 2025 and 2026 is now projected to be lower than anticipated in *Asian Development Outlook July 2025*, primarily due to the impact of higher tariffs. In the United States (US), tariff hikes are expected to dampen trade activity, increase production costs, and weigh on household consumption amid ongoing uncertainty over the possible resumption of reciprocal trade measures. The decline in US-bound exports is already affecting Japan's economy. In aggregate, the growth forecast for major advanced economies is revised down from 1.6% to 1.4% in 2025 and from 1.6% to 1.5% in 2026

PACIFIC FSM TIGHTENS PORT STATE MEASURES TO TACKLE IUU FISHING

The Federated States of Micronesia has enhanced its port state measures, using advanced risk analysis and data-driven tools to detect and block illegal fishing before it reaches its ports. The move strengthens compliance and supports international efforts for sustainable fisheries management in the WCPO.

ASIA US TARIFFS RESHAPE ASIA'S SHRIMP TRADE

The U.S.'s reciprocal tariffs on many shrimp-exporting countries are realigning global supply chains and forcing major Asian producers, including Vietnam, Indonesia, and India, to rethink their strategies. India, the largest shrimp supplier to the U.S, is facing a major blow from steep new tariffs, including a 25% reciprocal tariff that could rise to 50% under a new U.S. executive order. Combined with existing anti-dumping and countervailing duties, the total tariff burden may reach 58.26% despite India's efforts to offset losses through trade deals with other nations like the U.K.

THAILAND SKIPJACK PRICES HOLD FIRM AMID SLOW FISHING AND TARIFF PRESSURES

Skipjack tuna prices for August delivery in Bangkok stayed stable in July/August, with packers resisting upward moves. Market players expect prices to remain steady, with only limited scope for increases in September. The end of the WCPO FAD ban has seen poor fishing and slow reefer arrivals, while deals in Bangkok remain constrained following recent U.S. tariff actions on Thailand.

CHINA WHOLESALE MARKETS MAINTAIN STABLE FRESH SALMON PRICES

Atlantic salmon prices in China's major wholesale markets remained stable in week 35, with overall profitability hovering at break-even. A Guangzhou-based dealer noted losses of CNY 4/kg on Norwegian fish versus a CNY 2/kg profit on Faroese supply. With the new school term beginning in September, demand dynamics are expected to shift as students return to campus.

Japan

Japan's total fishery imports reached 2.12 million MT in 2024, up 0.58% from the previous year. Within this, imports of live, fresh, and chilled fish fell 5.7% to 33 258 MT, with fresh/chilled salmon accounting for 10 571 MT (+1.8%).

Fresh/chilled salmon imports have dropped sharply over the past five years - from 17 370 MT in 2020 to 10 571 MT in 2024 (-39%) - yet import values remained stable at ¥17-19 billion, reflecting firm consumer demand and higher unit prices. Norway continues to dominate supply despite lower volumes, while Australia and Canada remain steady secondary sources. Pacific salmon imports are minimal, mainly from New Zealand. The Japanese salmon market is clearly shifting toward lower volumes but higher value, driven by strong demand for sushi/sashimi-grade fish. However, rising competition from China and the Republic of Korea for Norwegian supply highlights Japan's ongoing dependence on a few key origins and the need to diversify sourcing strategies.

Malaysia:

Aquatic production in Malaysia has held steady at 1.8 - 1.9 million MT, with aquaculture growth offsetting declines in capture fisheries.

In the fresh, chilled, and live fish trade, imports stayed high in 2024 at 107 000 MT, while exports rebounded to 31 669 MT. By the first half of 2025, imports were down 11% compared to 2021, while exports were up nearly 30%, signaling stronger competitiveness (*refer fact sheet page #23 for Malaysia's annual fishery trade*).

JAPAN

Japan remains one of the world's largest seafood consumers, with steady demand for products like frozen fish meat (used in surimi, *kamaboko*, fish cakes, etc.). During the first half of the year, frozen fish meat imports increased by 10.17% compared to the previous year, while frozen fish fillet showed a marginal increase of 1.46% at 286 323 MT compared to the same period in 2024. Almost all main products under this category recorded increases, except for frozen salmon and trout fillets and flat fish fillets, which decreased slightly (- 1% each) respectively. Current lifestyle trends are shifting toward convenience foods and ready-to-eat meals, driving stronger demand for processed seafood that relies on frozen fish meat as a key raw material. In Japan, import volumes typically rise when processing plants increase production ahead of holiday periods or export seasons.

CHILLED & FROZEN TUNA
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Global trade in fresh and frozen tuna weakened marginally during the first half of 2025, totalling 1.25 million MT, compared with 1.30 million MT during the same period in 2024.

Demand for fresh tuna remained weak, with imports falling by 11.6% year-on-year to 38 543 MT during January–June 2025. Among the top five markets, imports increased in the USA, Spain and Portugal, but declined in Thailand and Japan. For the whole frozen tuna imports which are mostly used for reprocessing canned and other varieties of ready to eat products, the top importers were Thailand, Japan, Viet Nam, Philippines and Cote d’Ivoire. Demand for frozen tuna fillets remained firm across the markets, with Japan, USA, Spain, the Republic of Korea and Portugal as the leading importers.

Japan

Overall, demand for tuna in the sashimi trade was steady during June-July this year, supported by visiting tourists from the Asia Far East, even as local Japanese consumers traditionally avoid eating raw fish (*sashimi*) during the summer months.

At Tokyo’s *Toyosu* Market, auction prices for fresh and frozen *sashimi*-grade tuna were stable, reflecting stronger demand from the restaurant and catering sectors. Imports of large-sized Atlantic bluefin from North America (from USA and Canada, weighing 150-250kg/fish) increased, while imports of air-flown Southern bluefin tuna from New Zealand and Australia also increased in the auction market.

Local demand for *sashimi* tuna improved during ‘Obon’ the traditional festival celebrated in mid-August 13-15, when families gather to honor their ancestors. During this period the *Toyosu* auction market remained closed.

USA

Overall demand for non-canned tuna improved during the summer months, driven by increased out-of-home dining. Imports of frozen tuna fillets rose to 22 254 MT in the first half of the year, up 29% compared with the same period in 2024. However, seafood marketers in the USA have cautioned consumers about potential increases for high value tuna following the implementation of high tariffs, effective from August.

China

The surge in domestic tourism in China, has boosted business opportunities in the restaurant sector, particularly for the *sashimi* trade. During the first half of 2025, fresh tuna imports in China increased by 35% at 693 MT, with higher volumes of both Atlantic and Southern Bluefin tuna. The recent lifting of restrictions on seafood imports from Japan is expected to further support high-value bluefin supplies, catering to the country's 125 000 Japanese restaurants in the country.

Raw Materials for Canning and Other Uses

As reported in the previous issue, tuna packers in Thailand are increasingly substituting whole frozen tuna with semi-processed cooked loins to produce end-products. During January-June 2025, imports of cooked loins in Thailand reached 39 479 MT, up 16% year-on-year, with China, Indonesia and Viet Nam the main suppliers. In contrast, overall imports of whole frozen tuna were lower by 25 % during this period driven by a sharp decline in frozen skipjack imports while, frozen yellowfin and albacore imports recorded growth.

Europe

Semi-processed tuna raw materials remain popular among the tuna canners in Europe. During January-June 2025, imports of cooked frozen tuna loins reached 119 276MT, up 17% year-on-year. The top importers in ranking were Spain, Italy, Portugal and France; the main suppliers were China, Indonesia, Ecuador, Philippines, Viet Nam and Papua New Guinea. Imports also increased from Solomon Islands, Guatemala, and Colombia but declined from El Salvador during this period.

Outlook

Tuna catches in the WCPO (Western and Central Pacific Ocean) are likely to remain seasonally low until September due to the ongoing FAD fishing closure. As a result, raw material prices in international trade will continue to be influenced by the evolving supply-demand balance.

In Japan, the *sashimi* tuna trade traditionally remains sluggish in September before improving in October with the anticipated rise in foreign tourists expected to visit the country.

In the US, imports of high-value tuna are likely to slow down in the coming months, as some supply sources become subject to high tariffs.

In the European Union, canned tuna imports may slow down in the coming months, following heavy procurement during the first half of the year.

While imports of semi-processed and processed tuna recorded a 12.82% increase during January-June 2025. This stock build up may lead to some softening in demand during the third quarter of 2025.

SHRIMP

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The US authorities imposed ultra-high tariff on goods from certain countries effective from 1st August 2025. In view of this development, US shrimp importers accelerated procurement earlier in the year, particularly from Asian sources, which resulted in relatively large harvests of farmed shrimp in South and South East Asia during May and June. As of June 2025, cumulative U.S. shrimp imports increased by 15% year-on-year to 414 501 MT; this volume is 54 000 MT higher than the same period in 2024.

Since July/August shrimp farmers in India reported a drastic drop in ex-farm sales (down by almost 90 percent in August) due to weakening demand from their top market, the United States.

In Ecuador, the 2nd leading producer of farmed shrimp after China, production is seasonally low as the winter season sets in. The industry association in Ecuador reported some firming up in prices due to the low supply of farmed shrimp.

In China, domestic demand has been good during the summer months, benefitting local farms which supply head-on fresh shrimp through greenhouse aquaculture. Consequently, imports in the world's largest market during January–June 2025 were below last year's levels. While Ecuador's production between January–March 2025 held steady compared with 2024, its exports to both China and the United States fell during that period.

International trade

Imports

Global shrimp trade during the first half of 2025 was characterized by reduced imports in China, the world's largest market, alongside higher imports in the USA, Japan, European Union, the Republic of Korea and other emerging markets.

Meanwhile, global shrimp trade has been increasingly unpredictable due to evolving tariff policies, mainly with regard to the United States and particularly affecting products of Asian origin. Effective from 27 August 2025, U.S imports of shrimp are subject to tariffs ranging from 15% (Ecuador) to 50% (India).

During January–June 2025, cumulative shrimp imports into the United States reached 414 500 MT, 15% increase year-on-year, valued at USD 3.60 billion. Nearly 50 % (205 304 MT) of these imports comprised semi-processed raw frozen peeled, shrimp supplied by India, Ecuador, Indonesia and Viet Nam. Processed shrimp accounted for 22.7 % (94 109 MT) of total imports, making the United States and China the top importers of shrimp in value and volume, respectively. In general, more than 85 % of the seafood consumed in the United States is imported from countries like India, Ecuador, Viet Nam, and Thailand.

Europe

During the first half of 2025, shrimp imports in the European Union were marginally higher (2.80%) at 403 350 MT, year-on-year; which could be credited to increased consumption during the summer holiday season. Imports increased in Spain, France, Germany, Portugal and Greece but declined in the Netherlands, Italy, Denmark and Poland.

Asia

Japan, the second-largest shrimp market in Asia, after China bought more shrimp during January-June 2025 in anticipation of the summer demand associated with the surge in foreign tourist arrivals. During January-June, 2025, Japan imported nearly 100 000 MT of shrimp, marking its highest mid-year volume in five years. The top suppliers that benefited from this surge in demand were Viet Nam, India, Indonesia, Thailand and Ecuador. During this period, the Japan National Tourism Organization reported a total number of 21.5 million foreign visitors.

Exports

Strong import requirements in the United States induced exports from Ecuador, India, and Indonesia; exports, however, declined from Viet Nam, Thailand and Argentina. Intra-regional trade flow in South East Asia and the Far East was higher than the previous years as imports increased in Japan, the Republic of Korea for local consumption. Viet Nam and Thailand increased shrimp imports for export processing of value-added products during this period.

The supply trend from Ecuador to China, its top export market rebounded strongly after a previous downturn. Exports from Ecuador to the United States, Spain, France and Italy also increased during this period. Meanwhile, India, the world's second largest shrimp exporter, exported 162 267 MT of shrimp to USA, which was 24% higher than last year's same period. At the same time, China reversed its position in the international trade, exporting more value-added shrimp and buying less for domestic consumption.

LIVE, FRESH & FROZEN LOBSTER AND CRAB

Vietnam's crab exports hit a 10-year high, reaching US\$173 million in H1, 2025, up 38% year-on-year, led by strong demand from China, the EU, and Australia. According to the industry association -VASEP, full-year exports could surpass US\$350 million, this is despite of the sector's continuous challenges, related to quarantine procedures, farming code compliance, and pricing pressures.

Meanwhile in the US, the blue swimming crab market remains steady to firm, with only adequate supplies to meet moderate to active demand, despite continued upward pressure from tariffs (19% Indonesia, 20% Vietnam, 50% India), tightening inventories, and raw material shortages.

Global imports of canned and processed tuna continued to show positive growth in the first half of 2025 compared with the same period in 2024. Imports into the world's largest single market the USA, increased by 16.15% year-on-year. Thailand remained the leading supplier, accounting for 48.82% of the total, followed by Viet Nam, Ecuador, Mexico and Indonesia.

Cumulative imports of processed and canned tuna increased in the European Union Common Markets with a 13.35% rise in supply at 399 737 MT in comparison with the same period in 2024; nearly 30% (119 276 MT) of these volumes was the semi-processed cooked loins bought by the European tuna canners in Spain, Italy, France and Portugal.

Outside the EU, United Kingdom imports increased to 51 710 MT. In the Middle East, imports of canned tuna increased in key markets such as Libya, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Oman, but declined in the UAE, Iraq and Yemen. Meanwhile, major markets in Southeast Asia and the Far East namely Japan, Australia, Malaysia, New Zealand recorded increased imports of premium canned tuna products.
